



## Aubin vert B



### Name of vine variety in France

Aubin vert

### Origin

This variety is originally from the north east of France (Lorraine) and based on published genetic analyses was derived from the crossbreeding of Gouais B and Pinot.

### Synonymy

No synonym is recognized in France nor in other countries in the European Union.

### Regulations

In France, Aubin vert B is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

### Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a moderate to heavy coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are green with bronze patches,
- the shoot has red colored internodes,
- 3-lobed adult leaves with a V-shaped petiolar sinus or parallele edges, slight anthocyanin pigmentation of evines, slightly wavy leaf blade and the underside with a moderate coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the berries are round-shaped or obovoid shaped.

## Phenology

Bud burst: 6 days after Chasselas.

Grape maturity: period I, 1 and 1/2 to 2 weeks after Chasselas.

## Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Aubin vert B is rather fertile and productive and must be moderately pruned.

## Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Aubin vert B would appear not to be particularly sensitive to disease.

## Technological potential

The grape clusters are large and the berries are moderate size. Aubin vert B produces common wines, not very alcoholic and relatively acid.

## Clonal selection in France

There are no clones for this variety at the present time. Surveys are being carried out recently in vineyards in the north east of France.
