Name of vine variety in France

Aubin

Origin

This variety is originally from the North east of France (Lorraine) and based on published genetic analyses, it is derived from the crossbreeding of Gouais B and Savagnin.

Synonymy

No synonym is officially recognized in France, nor in other countries in the European Union.

Regulations

In France, Aubin B is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a heavy coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are green with bronze patches,
- the shoot with internodes has red stripes,
- adult leaves are 3-lobed with a closed petiolar sinus and overlapping lobes, open lateral sinuses with a U-shaped base; short teeth compared to width at base with straight or convex edges, heavy anthocyanin pigmentation of veins, upturned leaf blade, cupped, bubbled and the underside with a moderate coat of upright and flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas.

Grape maturity: period I, 1 and 1/2 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Aubin B is not very vigorous, early and moderately fertile. It must be planted in lightly exposed areas due to the risk of spring frost because of its very early bud burst.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Aubin B would appear not to be particularly susceptible to diseases.

Technological potential

Grape clusters are moderate in size and the berries are small. Aubin B produces average quality wines, not very aromatic and moderately acid.

Clonal selection in France

There are no clones for this variety at the present time. Surveys have recently been carried out in the vineyards in the north east of France.
