Origin

This variety is grown in Corsica under the name Barbarossa which appears to be of Provençal origin.

Synonymy

No synonym is officially recognized in France, nor in other countries of the European Union.

In France, Barbaroux Rs is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

Description

Identification signs include:

- the young leaves are green,
- adult leaves are 3, 5 or 7-lobed with deep lateral sinuses, a closed petiolar sinus, long teeth with straight sides, an absence of anthocyanin pigmentation, an upturned leaf blade and the underside with a moderate to heavy coat of upright hairs,
- round-shaped berries with a pink, non homogeneous skin color.

Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas.
Grape maturity: period II, 3 and 1/2 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

This variety is very fertile and has low to moderate vigor. Barbaroux Rs growing should be reserved to poor hot soils.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Barbaroux Rs is rather susceptible to powdery mildes and to grey rot.

Technological potential

The grape clusters and berries are large. Long maturation is necessary to obtain sufficient degrees for this vine variety. The products obtained (white wine making) are intense yellow (golden with amber tones), aromatic, not very acid and light bodied.

Clonal selection in France

The only approved Barbaroux Rs clone carries the number 937.
