### Description

Identification signs include:

- the tips of the young shoots have a sparse cover of flat-lying hairs,
- green young leaves with bronze patches,
- shoots with red internodes or with red streaks,
- heart-shaped adult leaves, 5 or 7-lobed, with a U-shaped or brace-shaped petiolar sinus, open to very open; small to medium size teeth, straight sides, low to moderate anthocyanin pigmentation of veins, flat or slightly jagged leaf blade, slightly bubbled; the underside has a moderate cover of upright hairs and no flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped berries.

## Phenology

Bud burst: 5 days before Chasselas. Grape maturity: period I, 1 and 1/2 weeks after Chasselas.

## Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Feteasca neagra N is a vigorous variety, fairly well adapted to drought and must be trellised and long pruned. Feteasca neagra N is moreover resistant to winter frost but sensitive to spring frosts due to its early bud burst.

## Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Feteasca neagra N is not very susceptible to powdery mildew. It is however more sensitive to downy mildew and grey rot.

## Technological potential

Feteasca neagra N clusters are small and berries are moderate size. This grape variety has high sugar and acidity content and produces well-balanced, colorful and pleasant wines.

## Clonal selection in France

The only approved Feteasca neagra N clone carries the number 1168.
