Name of vine variety in France

Garonnet

Origin

Garonnet N or 18 283 Seyve-Villard (an interspecific hybrid) results from the crossbreeding of Chancellor N (or 7053 Seibel) and Subéreux N (or 6905 Seibel).

Synonymy

In France, this variety can officially be called "18283 Seyve-Villard" for plant propagation matter.

Regulations

In France, Garonnet N is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

Description

Identification signs include:

- the tips of the young shoots have a slight coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are green,
- adult leaves are orbicular-shaped, 5 lobes with a slightly open or closed U-shaped petiolar sinus, moderate size teeth with straight sides, an upturned leaf blade, cupped and the underside with an absence or slight coat of upright and flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped or ovoid-shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas. Grape maturity: period II, 2 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Garonnet N is vigorous, fairly fertile and grows semi-erect which can be managed by moderate long pruning. Garonnet N is likewise somewhat susceptible to drought.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Garonnet N is fairly susceptible to downy mildew, powdery mildew and grey rot. This variety must be grafted.

Technological potential

The grape clusters are moderate to large in size, compact and the berries are moderate in size. Garonnet N produces ordinary quality wine, not very intense color but with the presence of diglucoside anthocyanins.

Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this variety at the present time.
