Origin

This variety was derived from Riesling B seedling obtained by C. Oberlin.

Synonymy

No synonym is officially recognized in France, nor in other countries of the European Union.

Regulations

In France, Goldriesling B is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

This variety is likewise listed in the Catalogues of other European Union member states including: Germany, Austria and Denmark.

Description

Identification signs include:

- the tips of the young shoot have a heavy coat of upright hairs,
- the young leaves are green with bronze patches,
- adult leaves are orbicular, 3 or 5 lobes with a closed petiolar sinus and slightly overlapping lobes producing rounded light, U-shaped base lateral sinuses, moderate size teeth with convex or straight sides, slight anthocyanin pigmentation of veins, jagged leaf blade and the underside with a moderate coat of upright hairs,
- round-shaped or short elliptical shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas.

Grape maturity: period I, 1 week after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Goldriesling B is not very vigourous. It is a good producer but fairly sensitive to winter frost. Its early bud burst likewise exposes it to spring frost.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Goldriesling B is susceptible to downy mildew and grey rot. It is less affected by powdery mildew.

Technological potential

Grape clusters and berries are small. Goldriesling B produces average quality wines.

Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this variety at the present time.
