This specific and native vine variety is from Haute-Savoie (Arve valley).

Synonymy

No synonym is officially recognized in France for this variety, nor in other countries in the European Union.

Regulations

In France, Gringet B is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

Description

Identification signs include:

- the young leaves are green,
- adult leaves are orbicular, whole or 3 lobes with a slightly open or closed petiolar sinus, short to moderate teeth with straight or convex sides, an absence of anthocyanin pigmentation, flat leaf blade and the underside with a slight coat of flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: 9 days after Chasselas.
Grape maturity: period II, 2 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

This variety is moderately productive and drooping. It must therefore be trained and short-pruned or managed with 'Guyot simple'. Gringet B produces good results on scree slopes.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Gringet B is susceptible to bud mite disease, powdery mildew and is very susceptible to downy mildew.

Technological potential

Grape clusters are large and the berries are small. This variety is more often used for making sparkling wines (sparkling or semi-sparkling wines). Gringet B wines are light, lively with floral notes.

Clonal selection in France

The only approved Gringet B clone carries the number 947. A conservatory of 15 or so clones was set up in 1999 in vineyards in the Savoie region.
