Mancin N is originally from the Bordeaux vineyards region.

Synonymy

No synonym is officially recognized in France for this variety, nor in other countries in the European Union.

Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoots has a heavy coat of flat-lying hairs,
- young leaves are green with bronze patches,
- adult leaves have 5 lobes with an open petiolar sinus with a U-shaped base; small teeth with straight or convex sides, a slightly revolute leaf blade and the underside with a moderate coat of upright and flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: 3 days after Chasselas.

Grape maturity: period II, 2 and 1/2 to 3 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Mancin N displays early bud burst and moderate vigor. It is generally long pruned. Moderate fertility but with a steady production.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Mancin N is not very susceptible to powdery mildew.

Technological potential

Grape clusters are large and the berries are moderate in size. Mancin N produces fairly balanced, well colored, relatively acid and not very astringent wines.

Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this vine variety at the present time.
