The description corresponds to Muscat à petits grains blancs B except for the berry skin color which when it reaches maturity is dark red.

Phenology

Bud burst: 2 days before Chasselas. Grape maturity: period I, 1 and 1/2 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Aptitudes are close to Muscat à petits grains blancs B. Muscat à petits grains rouges Rg would however appear to be a little earlier.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Behavior with regard to diseases is comparable to Muscat à petits grains blancs B and perhaps with less susceptibility to powdery mildew and grey rot.

Technological potential

Grape clusters and berries are moderate in size. Muscat à petits grains rouges Rg produces quality dry and sweet wine. These wines have an average color with a potential and good balance between sugar content and acidity.

Clonal selection in France

The only approved Muscat à petits grains roses Rs clone carries the number 1194.
