Regulations

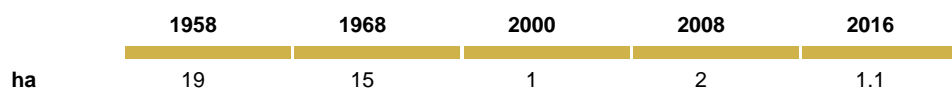
In France, Olivette blanche B is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a slight coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are green with bronze patches,
- adult leaves are orbicular shaped, whole or with 5 lobes, with shallow lateral sinuses, an open petiolar sinus with a V-shaped base, small teeth, short compared to width at base, straight sides; an absence of coloration of veins, a smooth and shiny leaf blade and the underside with an absence or very slight coat of upright and flat-lying hairs,
- female flowers,
- elliptical-shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: 7 days after Chasselas.

Grape maturity: period III, 5 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Olivette blanche B is a late harvest variety, moderate vigor with erect or semi-erect growth. It can be managed by long pruning. Due to its female nature, Olivette blanche B is very susceptible to coulure and millerandage.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Olivette blanche B is not very susceptible to grey rot.

Technological potential

Grape clusters are loose and small to moderate size. The berries are large, irregular sized due to millerandage, with a thick skin, fleshy pulp and simple flavor.

Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this vine variety at the present time.
