### Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a heavy coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are green or yellow,
- adult leaves are wedge to orbicular-shaped, whole or with 3 or 5 lobes, an open or slightly open petiolar sinus with a U-shaped base, shallow lateral sinuses, moderate teeth with straight sides; a smooth leaf blade, slightly revolute, folded near the petiolar point and the underside with a slight coat of upright hairs and a moderate coat of flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped berries.

## Phenology

Bud burst: 9 days after Chasselas.

Grape maturity: period III, 4 and 1/2 weeks after Chasselas.

## Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Pascal B is a fertile and very productive vine variety which grows erect. It is well adapted to being gobelet trained and it must be short-pruned. This vine variety is well suited to very exposed, very dry and poor terroirs.

## Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Pascal B is very susceptible to powdery mildew and to grey rot.

## Technological potential

Grape clusters are very large and the berries are large. Pascal B produces dry and neutral white wines with no particular finesse and a low degree of alcohol.

## Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this variety at the present time.
