



## Précoce bousquet B



### Name of vine variety in France

Précoce Bousquet

### Origin

This vine variety was selected by M. Bousquet in the Tarn region and corresponds to the traditional Hungarian vine variety Honigler.

### Synonymy

There are no recognized synonyms for this variety in France. In Slovenia, Précoce Bousquet B can officially be called by the name "Bela".

### Regulations

In France, Précoce Bousquet B is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties".

### Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a densely covered coat of flat-lying hairs,
- orbicular-shaped leaves, 3 or 5 lobes with an open petiolar sinus with a U-shaped base, closed lateral sinuses with slightly overlapping lobes with a U-shaped base; moderate size teeth compared to width at base, straight sides; an absence of anthocyanin coloration of veins, an upturned leaf blade and the underside with a moderate to heavy coat of upright hairs and a sparse coat of flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped or slightly flat berries.

## Phenology

Bud burst: 4 days after Chasselas. Grape maturity: period I, 1/2 week after Chasselas.

## Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Précoce Bousquet B has moderate fertility and should preferably be long pruned.

## Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Précoce Bousquet B is susceptible to grey rot.

## Technological potential

Grape clusters are moderate to large and the berries are moderate size. Précoce Bousquet B produces rather warm but neutral wines.

## Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this vine variety at the present time.
