### Name of vine variety in France

Roublot

### Origin

This vine variety is originally from the Yonne region and based on published genetic analyses, is derived from the crossbreeding of Pinot and Gouais B.

### Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a moderate coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are yellow with bronze patches,
- adult leaves have 5 or 7 lobes (central lobe is divided) with a slightly open or with slightly overlapping lobes, moderate to long teeth compared to width at base, straight sides, moderate anthocyanin coloration of veins; a jagged leaf blade, revolute and bubbled and the underside with a moderate coat of upright hairs,
- short elliptical-shaped berries.

## Phenology

Bud burst: same as Chasselas.  
Grape maturity: period I, 1 and 1/2 weeks after Chasselas.

## Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Roublot B grows semi erect. Good but irregular fertility which is why it must be long pruned.

## Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Roublot B is susceptible to powdery mildew and grey rot.

## Technological potential

Grape clusters and berries are small. Roublot B produces white wines with a deep yellow color, which are however fine with certain aromatic characteristics.

## Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this vine variety at the present time.
