Origin

Seinoir N or 8745 Seibel (an interspecific hybrid) is derived from the crossbreeding of 5163 Seibel and 880 Seibel.

Synonymy

In France, this vine variety can officially be called "8745 Seibel" for plant propagating material.

Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip fo the young shoot has a sparse coat of flat-lying hairs,
- bronze young leaves,
- pentagonal or orbicular-shaped adult leaves, whole or 3 lobes with a slightly open V-shaped petiolar sinus or closed with slightly overlapping lobes, very long teeth compared to width at base, straight sides or with one convex and one concave side, an upturned and cupped leaf blade and the underside with a moderate coat of upright hairs,
- round-shaped or short elliptical-shaped berries.

Phenology

Bud burst: 6 days before Chasselas.
Grape maturity: period I, same as Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Seinoir N is moderately vigorous.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Seinoir N is susceptible to downy mildew and grey rot but resists well against powdery mildew. It must likewise be grafted.

Technological potential

Grape clusters are small to moderate size and the berries are moderate size with a foxy and herbaceous flavor. Seinoir N produces mediocre, very colored wines with the presence of diglucoside anthocyanins.

Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this vine variety at the present time.
