Description

Identification signs include:

- the tip of the young shoot has a heavy coat of flat-lying hairs,
- the young leaves are yellow,
- adult leaves are pentagonal-shaped, whole or 3 lobed, a slightly open petiolar sinus with parallel edges or slightly overlapping lobes; short teeth compared to width at base with right sides, absence of anthocyanin coloration of veins, bubbled and the underside with a slight to moderate coat of upright and flat-lying hairs,
- round-shaped or slightly elliptical-shaped berries, often times with small berries which remain green.

Phenology

Bud burst: 4 days after Chasselas.
Grape maturity: period II, 3 weeks after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

This vine variety grows upright is fertile and productive and is well adapted to being short pruned.

Sensitivity to diseases and pests

Valdigué N is slightly susceptible to grey rot and powdery mildew.

Technological potential

Grape clusters and berries are moderate to large in size. Valdigué N produces colored and shiny wines, light with a low degree of alcohol with tannins which are somewhat astringent.

Clonal selection in France

There are no approved clones for this variety at the present time.
