Origin

This variety is originally from Savoie. Based on genetic analyses carried out in Montpellier, Dousset would be closely related to Gouais.

Synonyms

There is no officially recognized synonym in France nor in the other countries of the European Union, for this variety.

Legal information

In France, Dousset is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties" since 2019 on the A list but is not yet classified.

Use

Wine grape variety.

Descriptive elements

The identification is based on:

- the tip of the young shoot with a low to medium density of prostate hairs,
- the reddish young leaves,
- the shoots with red nodes and internodes,
- the medium to large, dark green adult leaves, with three or five lobes, a slightly open V- or U-shaped petiole sinus, long teeth compared to their width at the base with straight sides or with one side concave and one side convex, a moderate to strong anthocyanin coloration of veins, a flat or involute, blistered, slightly goffered leaf blade, and on the lower side of the leaves, a low density of erect and prostate hairs,
- the round-shaped berries.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Dousset can be very fertile and has a horizontal bearing. It is sensitive to millerandage.

Susceptibility to diseases and pests

Dousset does not seem to be particularly sensitive to pests and diseases.

Technological potentiality

Dousset's bunches are large, winged and compact. The berries are also large, simple-flavored, with a thick skin and a firm pulp. The juice yields are rather high. Dousset produces ordinary wines.

Clonal selection in France

There is no certified clone for this variety yet.
