Muscat à petits grains roses

Origin

This variety corresponds to the pink mutation of Muscat à petits grains blancs.

Synonyms

In the European Union, Muscat à petits grains roses is officially called by other names: Moscatel de Grano Menudo Rojo (Spain) and Muskateller (Germany). These synonyms are officially recognized in France regarding plant propagation material.

Legal information

In France, Muscat à petits grains roses is officially listed in the "Catalogue of vine varieties" on the A list and classified. This variety is also listed in the catalogues of other Member States of the European Union: Germany and Spain.

Descriptive elements

The description corresponds to that of Muscat à petits grains blancs except for the berry skin color when ripe, which is pink in this case. The berries are sometimes slightly obloid.

Phenology

Bud burst: 2 days before Chasselas.
Grape maturity: early-season, 1 week after Chasselas.

Suitability for cultivation and agronomic production

Aptitudes are similar to those of Muscat à petits grains blancs. Muscat à petits grains roses however appears to be a little bit earlier.

Susceptibility to diseases and pests

The behavior of this variety toward diseases is comparable to that of Muscat à petits grains blancs.

Technological potentiality

The bunches are small to medium in size and the berries are medium to large. Muscat à petits grains roses produces wines with a comparable quality of those produced with Muscat à petits grains blancs.

Clonal selection in France

The only certified Muscat à petits grains roses clone carries the number 1172.
